LAWS OF THE UNIVERSITY

(AFFILIATION OF HOMOEOPATHY MEDICAL COLLEGE) STATUTES

B.H.M.S. / M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 42 of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, Act, 1987 (Tamil Nadu Act 37 of 1987), and in supersession of the Statutes for Affiliation of Homoeopathy Medical College {B.H.M.S. / M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY)}, the Governing Council of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, hereby makes the following Statutes:-

- (i) These statutes may be called the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University (Affiliation of Homoeopathy Medical College) Statutes B.H.M.S. / M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY).
- (ii) They shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor.

2. The words and phrases used in these statutes shall unless expressly explained otherwise, have the same meaning as they have with reference to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, Act, 1987 (Tamil Nadu Act 37 of 1987) hereinafter called "the Act"

3. It shall be necessary for the proposed Homoeopathy Medical College seeking Provisional Affiliation to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, for starting First Batch of Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) Degree course to apply for "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" of their application with the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

4. (i) Only Educational Trust / Society (hereinafter referred to as “applicant”) with sufficient financial soundness and which satisfy the conditions stipulated hereunder in sub-statute (ii) shall be eligible for starting a Homeopathy Medical College. Application from individuals for “Letter of Consent of Affiliation” will not be entertained.

(ii) Conditions to be satisfied by the applicant applying for “Letter of Consent of Affiliation”:

(a) “The applicant shall own and possess a hospital being run by it with not less than 100 beds with an administrative block or shall have a tie-up with a Hospital with a minimum of 100 beds within a radius of 30 km.

(b) The hospital and administrative block are to have been located in an area of not less than 3 (three) acres in a Corporation area or 5 (five) acres within the Municipal limits or 7 acres in other areas.

5. The application for “Letter of Consent of Affiliation” from the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, shall be in writing and in Form I annexed with these statutes addressed to the Registrar of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai and shall be submitted to the Registrar within 1st July and 31st October of every year.

6. (1) The application for “Letter of Consent of Affiliation” shall be submitted along with the Essentiality Certificate of the Government of Tamil Nadu to establish the college and contain the following particulars, namely:-

(a) Name of the Trust / Society with full address;

(b) Name of the proposed Homoeopathy Medical College;

- (c) Address where the Homoeopathy Medical College is to be located with telephone No, Web, Email, etc.;
- (d) Details regarding the administrative block of the hospital and its location;
- (e) Details of the hospital with plan, owned by the Trust / Society such as:-
 - (i) The staff working (both of hospital and administrative):
 - (ii) Number of out-patient sections like Medicine, Surgery, Paediatrics, Midwifery;
 - (iii) Facilities like Radiology, Clinical, Laboratory, Blood Bank and operation Theatre, etc;
 - (iv) Daily out-patients turn over;
 - (v) Bed occupancy;
 - (vi) Master plan for the development of the Hospital as a future teaching hospital with strength of two hundred beds with all necessary facilities and scope for further development including specialities;
 - (vii) Facilities like workshop, laundry, canteen, auditorium, etc;
 - (viii) Location & details of hostels for men and women separately;
 - (ix) Location & particulars of play ground;
 - (x) Staff quarters proposed;
 - (xi) Master plan of the college and Naturopathy hospital complex, either in total or phased programme;

- f) Particulars as to the availability of Land, Building, other physical infrastructure etc.
- g) Number of students proposed to be admitted in the first batch of the BHMS Degree course.
- h) Particulars as to the availability of training facility for the students to be admitted in the college:
- i) Particulars as to the availability of ready built area for the accommodation of the academic complex and residential quarters for the staff of the proposed college.
- j) Inspection Proforma duly filled-in pertaining to issue of Certificate of Registration;
- k) Total population of the area in and around 20 kms of radius of the area in which the Homoeopathy Medical College is to be located.
- l) Availability of water supply, transport facilities, development potential, etc.
- m) Details regarding the financial soundness of the applicant with supporting documents to show that it has the capacity to deposit Rs.20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty lakhs only) as Security Deposit i.e.
 - (i) Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten lakhs only) at the time of Provisional Affiliation for First Batch of BHMS Degree course.

(ii) Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten lakhs only) at the time of Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for Second Batch of BHMS Degree course.

(2) The applicant shall also furnish proof to show that the Trust has an annual receipt of Rs.15,00,000/- (Rupees fifteen lakhs only) excluding the interest drawn from the amount referred to in clause (m) of sub-statute (i) above.

(3) The applicant shall also enclose a payment receipt for processing fee of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only), Inspection fee for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) and cost of application for Rs.1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time.

7. On receipt of the application for the "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" the University shall scrutinise the same and verify by deputing an Inspection Commission whether the conditions required to be fulfilled by the applicant to become eligible to receive the said Letter of Consent of Affiliation are fulfilled.

8. The Inspection Commission shall specifically examine whether the following conditions are fulfilled by the applicant and make a detailed report to the University.

CONDITIONS TO BE FULFILLED BY THE APPLICANT TO BECOME ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE THE "LETTER OF CONSENT OF AFFILIATION" FOR PROVISIONAL AFFILIATION:-

- (a) The applicant shall satisfy the University that they have clear title to the lands specified in Statute No.4(ii) (b) without any encumbrance and shall furnish the title deeds and such other

documents as required by the University from time to time in this regard.

- (b) The applicant shall fulfill necessary provisions of relevant Acts on the subject such as Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning Act, 1971 (Tamil Nadu Act 35 of 1972) and Tamil Nadu Land Reforms (Fixation of Ceiling on Land) Act, 1961 (Tamil Nadu Act 58 of 1961) or other local body Acts as in force and shall also ensure the evidence so produced in this regard is valid and relating to the applicant.
- (c) The applicant shall also satisfy, that they have actual physical possession of the lands and shall furnish necessary documents in this regard and such other documents required by the University from time to time.
- (d) The applicant shall satisfy the University that all the infrastructural facilities of the college as prescribed in the Central Council of Homoeopathy are in one campus.
- (e) The Inspection Commission shall examine and satisfy itself with the staff facilities and performance of the existing hospital, the master plan for future developments and the financial viability of the applicant in relation to the movable immovable properties, the bank balance, interest accrued on the same and its capability to deposit a sum of Rs.20,00,000/- (Rupees twenty lakhs only) in a Nationalised Bank or Tamil Nadu Government Undertaking / Corporation which accepts fixed deposits in two phases of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees ten lakhs only) each Further, the

applicant must be in a sound financial position so as to have an annual receipt of not less than Rs. 15,00,000/- (Rupees fifteen lakhs only) excluding the interest accrued from the aforesaid deposit.

9. The University, if fully satisfied on the basis of the report of the Inspection Commission that all the conditions required to be fulfilled by the applicant are fulfilled, shall issue a Letter of Consent of Affiliation in Form No.II annexed with these statutes on production of a payment receipt for Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only) towards fee for issue of Letter of Consent of Affiliation, to the applicant to enable the applicant to make further arrangements to start the First Batch of BHMS Degree course in the proposed Homoeopathy Medical College.

Provided that it shall be competent for the University to show preference in granting the "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" in respect of applicants who propose to set up the Homoeopathy Medical college in an area where there is a population of not less than two lakhs and which area is so located that in and around twenty K.M. of the area there is a population of ten lakhs and if the area is in a district where there are no Homoeopathy Medical college, provided the area is having adequate supply of water, transport facilities, development potential and easy accessibility to other places.

10. The issue of the "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" alone shall not confer any right on the application to start the BHMS Degree course.

11. The applicant on receipt of the "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" from the University, shall apply along with a copy of Inspection Proforma duly filled in to the University for Provisional Affiliation of First Batch of BHMS Degree course, in Form III annexed with these statutes and shall fulfil the conditions stipulated

in statute 12 to enable the University to appoint and send an Inspection Commission to the proposed Homoeopathy Medical College.

12. The applicant shall, before applying for Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of BHMS Degree course fulfil the following conditions namely:-

- (a) Shall have obtained the Letter of permission from the Dept. of AYUSH, Health and Family welfare Department, New Delhi to start a Homoeopathy Medical College.
- (b) Shall have appointed a qualified Principal for Homoeopathy Medical College.
- (c) Shall have obtained consent letters for appointment of qualified staff members for the departments as prescribed by Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi from time to time (Annexure) which are absolutely essential to become eligible to start the First Batch of- BHMS Degree course.

13. The applicant after fulfilling the conditions stipulated in statutes 12 shall intimate the fact to the University along with a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the inspection fee payable to the University and shall request the University to depute its inspection commission.

14. On receipt of the above intimation the University shall send its Inspection Commission to inspect the facilities available at the proposed Homoeopathy Medical College with reference to the Inspection Proforma submitted by the applicant and to submit report to the University as to the satisfactory fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled. At the time of inspection atleast 90% of teaching staff should be present, while posting order and acceptance in respect

of all other teaching staff should be made available. The Inspection Commission shall also report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of any of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the applicant to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions, the University may conduct re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

15. After a detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission and if the University is fully satisfied as to the fulfillment of the conditions for the Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of BHMS Degree course, the University shall direct the applicant to remit a sum of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees ten lakhs only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time payable by the applicant towards the 1st instalment of security deposit. The security deposit shall be invested in a fixed deposit in a "Nationalised Bank or Government undertaking / Corporation which accepts fixed deposits jointly in the name of the Registrar, the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, and in the name of the applicant. The fixed deposit receipt shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar. The interest accrued thereon shall be utilised towards the maintenance of the Homoeopathy Medical College and the applicant shall submit an utilisation certificate in this regard in Form No. IV annexed with these statutes, at the end of every academic year.

16. On the remittance of the 1st instalment of security deposit as specified in statute 15 by the applicant and on receipt of the intimation from the applicant that all the staff members appointed are in a position to start the teaching course, the University shall grant Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of BHMS course for fifty students after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.3,00,000/- (Rupees three lakhs only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time, from the applicant towards the fee for the Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of BHMS degree course.

17. The applicant shall show evidence of annual receipt of not less than Rs.15,00,000/- (Rupees fifteen lakhs only) excluding the interest accrued from the security deposit mentioned in these statutes to facilitate the proper running of the Homoeopathy Medical College. This is only a portion of the liability which the college is likely to incur every year towards payment of salaries of the staff and the maintenance of the college.

18. (1) The Provisional Affiliation granted by the University as specified in Statute

No.16 shall be only for the First Batch of BHMS Degree course. Only thereupon the college shall be permitted to admit students in such number in the First Batch of BHMS Degree course as the University decides. The college shall not admit students before such permission by the University.

(2) Every college shall have a duly constituted Governing body with representatives of the teaching staff, to advise the Principal in the internal affairs of the college. A record of proceedings of the said Governing Body of the college shall be maintained by the Principal.

- (3) Any change in the Governing Body of the college shall be reported to the University immediately.
- (4) The Homoeopathy Medical college shall furnish a budget for each year of study and a separate development budget which will cover the expenses for the fulfillment of the requirements prescribed for the Second Batch of BHMS degree course.
- (5) The Governing Body of the college shall meet atleast once in three months to consider the budget estimates and such other matters as may arise in its working. It shall meet in May-June each year to consider the Annual Report, the audited statement of accounts, changes in the staff, subjects or courses for which fresh Provisional Affiliation or approval is to be sought in the following year. A copy of the notice of meeting shall be sent to the Registrar, atleast fifteen clear days before the date of the meeting. A copy of the minutes of the meeting shall also be sent to the Registrar within fifteen days of the meeting.

19. By the time only six months period is left for the commencement of Second Batch of BHMS Degree Course, the applicant shall apply to the University along with a copy of Inspection Proforma duly filled in & with a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) towards Inspection fee or such amount as may be prescribed by Governing Council from time to time for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Second Batch of BHMS Degree Courses in Form III annexed with these statutes in the Homoeopathy Medical College and the details thereof shall be furnished in the said application (As Per Annexure).

20. On receipt of the application for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the second Batch of BHMS Degree course, the University shall send its Inspection Commission atleast three months before the commencement of Second Batch of BHMS Degree course.

21. The Inspection Commission sent by the University shall inspect the facilities made available by the management of the college duly verifying the Inspection Proforma and report to the University as to whether all the facilities required to be provided by the college are provided. The Inspection Commission shall also point out in its report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the college to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions the University may conduct re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand Only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

22. After a detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission, if the University is fully satisfied as to the fulfillment of the conditions for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Second Batch of BHMS degree course, the University shall direct the applicant to remit a sum of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees ten lakhs only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time, towards the IInd and Final Instalment of security deposit payable by the applicant. The security deposit shall be invested in a fixed deposit in a Nationalised Bank or Government

undertaking / Corporation which accepts fixed deposits jointly in the name of the Registrar, the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, and in the name of the applicant. The fixed deposit receipt shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar. The interest accrued on the fixed deposit shall be spent on the maintenance of the Homoeopathy Medical College and the applicant shall submit an utilisation certificate in this regard in Form No. IV annexed with these statutes, at the end of every academic year.

23. On the remittance of the security deposit as specified in statute 22 by the applicant and on receipt of the of the intimation from the applicant that all the staff members appointed in pursuance of the above statutes are in a position to conduct the teaching course and on production of approval from AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and the Central Council of Homoeopathy, the university shall, after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) or such amount may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time from the applicant towards the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation fee for the Second Batch of BHMS degree course, grant Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Second Batch of BHMS degree course and for the existing batch.

24. The Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted by the University as specified No.23 shall be only for the second batch of BHMS degree course and for the existing batch.

25. The Homoeopathy Medical College shall furnish a budget for each year of study.

26. By the time only six months period is left for the commencement of Third Batch of BHMS degree course, the applicant shall apply to the University for

Continuance of Provisional Affiliation of the Third Batch of BHMS degree course, in Form III annexed to these statutes along with the Inspection Proforma duly filled in. Before applying so, the applicant shall ensure that all the facilities and departments with the required staff members specified in Statute Nos.12 (c), (d) and 19 are continued to be provided in the college and the details therefor shall be furnished in the application. The application for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation shall be accompanied by the Inspection Proforma duly filled in and a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards inspection fee.

27. On receipt of the application for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the third Batch of BHMS degree course from the applicant, the University shall send its Inspection Commission atleast five months before the commencement of the Third Batch of BHMS degree Course.

28. The Inspection Commission sent by the University shall inspect the facilities available in the college duly verifying the Inspection Proforma submitted by the applicant and report to the University as to whether all the facilities required to be provided by the college are actually provided. The Inspection commission shall also point out in its report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also indicate as to the capability of the applicant to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions the University may conduct such re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be

prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

29. After a detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission, if the University is fully satisfied as to the fulfillment of the conditions for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for Third Batch of BHMS degree course and on receipt of the intimation from the applicant that all the staff members appointed in pursuance of the above statutes are in a position to conduct the teaching course and on production of approval from AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and the Central Council of Homoeopathy, the University shall, after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) or such amount may be prescribed by the Governing Council towards the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation fee for the third batch of BHMS degree course, grant Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the third batch of BHMS degree course and for the existing batches.

30. The Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted by the University as specified No.29 shall be only for the third batch of BHMS degree course and for the existing batches.

31. The Homoeopathy Medical College shall furnish a budget for each year.

32. By the time only six months period is left for the commencement of Fourth Batch of BHMS degree course, the applicant shall apply to the University for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation of the fourth batch of BHMS degree course, in Form III annexed to these statutes. Before applying so, the applicant shall ensure that all the facilities and Departments with full compliment of staff members specified in Statute Nos.12 (c), (d) and 19 are continued to be

provided in the college and the details therefor shall be furnished in the application. The application for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation shall be accompanied by the Inspection Proforma duly filled in and a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards inspection fee.

33. On receipt of the application for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the fourth batch of BHMS degree course from the applicant, the University shall send its Inspection Commission atleast five months before the commencement of the Fourth Batch of BHMS degree Course.

34. The Inspection Commission sent by the University shall inspect the facilities available in the college duly verifying the Inspection Proforma submitted by the Management and report to the University as to whether all the facilities required to be provided by the college are actually provided. The Inspection commission shall also point out in its report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the applicant to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions the University may conduct such re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

35. After a detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission, if the University is fully satisfied as to the fulfillment of the conditions for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for fourth batch of

BHMS degree course and on receipt of the intimation from the applicant that all the staff members appointed in pursuance of the above statutes are in a position to conduct the teaching course and on production of approval from AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and the Central Council of Homoeopathy, the University shall, after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council towards the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation fee for the fourth batch of BHMS degree course, grant Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Fourth Batch of BHMS degree course and for the existing batches.

36. The Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted by the University as specified No.35 shall be only for the fourth batch of BHMS Degree course and for the existing batches.

37. The Homoeopathy Medical College shall furnish a separate development budget which will cover the expenses for the Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship training.

COMPULSORY ROTATORY RESIDENT INTERNSHIP (CRR) TRAINING

38. By the time only six months period is left for the commencement of Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course the applicant shall apply to the University for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course including Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship Training. Before applying so, as prescribed by Central Council of Homoeopathy, (Annexure) facilities and departments with the staff members stipulated in the CCH have to be provided by the applicant and the details thereof shall be furnished in the application for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation. The application for the Continuance of

Provisional Affiliation for the Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course including CRRIT Training shall be accompanied with the Inspection Proforma duly filled in and a payment receipt towards Inspection fee for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the inspection fee.

39. On receipt of the application for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course including Compulsory Rotary Resident Internship Training, the University shall send its Inspection Commission atleast five months before the date of commencement of the Fifth Batch of BHMS Degree course.

40. The Inspection Commission sent by the University shall inspect the facilities made available by the applicant duly verifying the Inspection Proforma submitted by the Management and report to the University as to whether all the facilities required to be provided. The Inspection Commission shall also point out in its reports the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the college to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions the University may conduct re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

41. After a detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission, if the University is fully satisfied as to the fulfillment of the

conditions for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course including of Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship Training, and on receipt of the intimation from the applicant that all the staff members appointed in pursuance of the above statutes are in a position and on production of approval from AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and the Central Council of Homoeopathy, the University shall after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time, towards the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation fee for the said course grant Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Fifth Batch of BHMS degree course including Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship Training and for the existing batches

42. The applicant seeking Continuance of Provisional Affiliation shall follow the modifications in the course contents suggested by the Boards of Studies and Standing Academic Board of the University from time to time.

43. All the norms prescribed by the Central Council of Homoeopathy may be applied by the University in the area not covered by the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations framed by the Tamil Nadu. Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, for starting of a new Homoeopathy Medical College, whenever considered necessary.

44. The applicant shall send to the University every year a report regarding the service, academic and research activities of the college.

45. GRANT OF CONTINUANCE OF PROVISIONAL AFFILIATION FOR SUBSEQUENT BATCHES OF B.H.M.S. DEGREE COURSE:-

The Management of the Homoeopathy Medical college shall apply to this University after complying with the requisite facilities, as prescribed by the

Central Council of Homoeopathy and AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, New Delhi, from time to time for grant of Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for subsequent batches of B.H.M.S. degree course as prescribed for fourth batch of B.H.M.S. degree course stated above along with the fee prescribed therefor.

46. The applicant of the affiliated college may apply to this University for increase in seats in under-graduate course upto a maximum of one hundred (100) seats only. Permission for increase in seats beyond one hundred will not be granted.

47. The Governing Council shall be competent to entertain or decline for reasons to be recorded in writing, the application received from the application for increase in the number of seats in the college subject to the ceiling specified in statute No. 46. The University will review the clinical facilities provided by the institutions and progress of clinical performance of the hospitals viz-a-vis the population potential around the hospital and public interest covered at large, while entertaining the application for increase of seats.

48. No Homoeopathy Medical College shall apply to the University for increase in seats until the first batch students successfully completed the course and leave the college and the BHMS Degree course so obtained is recognized by the Central Council of Homoeopathy and after obtaining the Provisional Affiliation from the University.

49. The applicant shall follow the procedure enumerated for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation and satisfy the University regarding the following norms as prescribed by the University and the Central Council of Homoeopathy and AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, New Delhi in this regard from

time to time while making application for increase in the seats in Form No.VI annexed with these statutes.

- (i) Permission from State Government of
Tamil Nadu.
- (ii) Proportionate increase in the staff pattern;
- (iii) Proportionate increase in the equipment and Laboratory facilities;
- (iv) Proportionate increase in the accommodation;
- (v) Inspection Proforma duly filled in and
- (vi) Expansion of library

50. On receipt of the application from the applicant for increase in seats along with the Inspection Proforma duly filled in, the University shall appoint an Inspection Commission to inspect the suitability of the facilities provided by the college for such increase in seats on production of a payment receipt towards processing fee of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only), Inspection fee for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) and cost of application for Rs.1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time, shall be paid by the applicant.

51. The Inspection Commission referred to in statute 50 shall report to the University duly verifying the filled-in Inspection Proforma as to whether all the requirements specified in statute 49 have been provided by the applicant. The Inspection commission shall also point out in its report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the requirements to be provided and also advise as to the capability of the applicant to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions the University may conduct

such re-inspection wherever necessary on production of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

52. On receipt of the final report of the above Inspection Commission and if the report is found satisfactory the University shall recommend to the Central Council of Homoeopathy for its inspection and concurrence.

53. On receipt of the concurrence from the Central Council of Homoeopathy to increase the seat in the college concerned the University shall grant Permission to the college concerned to admit students in the seats so increased.

54. The permission granted to the applicant by the University under statute 53 is liable to be withdrawn if any of the norms prescribed in the statute 49 is violated. In case of such withdrawal, the permission shall be restored only when a satisfactory report is received by the University on an inspection that the norms prescribed in the statute 49 have been duly complied with.

55. Post Graduate Degree Course in Homoeopathy means the course defined in the Homoeopathy (Post Graduate Degree Course) M.D.(Hom.) Regulations 1989 as amended upto 2001 of the Central Council of Homoeopathy. The course shall be of 3 years duration having two Parts I & II. Part I is 18 months duration, out of which the first 12 months shall be of compulsory house job. Part II consists of 18 months devoted to speciality subjects.

56. The Homoeopathy Medical Colleges which intend to start Post Graduate Degree courses in Homoeopathy under Provisional Affiliation with the University shall obtain the prior permission of the Central Government in accordance with Section 12A of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 as amended by the Central Act 51 of 2002 and the Regulations and the schemes notified thereunder.

57. The Homoeopathy Medical College seeking Provisional Affiliation to the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, for starting Post Graduate Degree course shall apply to the University for issue of "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" to enable it to obtain the permission of the Central Government referred to in Statute 56 above.

58. The Homoeopathy Medical Colleges which are conducting under graduate course (B.H.M.S. Degree Course) are only eligible to apply for "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" referred to in Statute 57 above for starting Post Graduate Homoeopathy Degree Course.

59. The application for the issue of "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" shall be in writing and in Form 'A' annexed to these Statutes and addressed to the

Registrar of the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai. The application shall be submitted to the University up to 31st October of every year along with a copy of the Essentiality Certificate obtained from the State Government.

60. The application shall contain the following particulars:-

(f) The applicant College / Institution shall furnish an undertaking that it shall fulfill the requirements specified by the University from time to time.

(g) The College shall also provide other infrastructures required for starting First Batch of course at the time of inspection for issue of "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" .

62. The applicant College / Institution after fulfilling the conditions stipulated in the above Statute shall apply to the University in writing along with duly filled-in inspection proforma and a payment receipt towards processing fee of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand only) per branch, Inspection fee of Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) & Cost of application of Rs.1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time in the prescribed application form (Form A) for issue of "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" and shall request the University to depute its Inspection Commission.

63. On receipt of the intimation referred to in Statute 62, the University shall send its Inspection Commission to inspect the facilities available in the applicant college and to submit report to the University as to the satisfactory fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled. The Inspection Commission shall specifically verify with reference to the Inspection Proforma submitted by the applicant and also report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of any of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the College / Institution to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions, the University may conduct such re-inspection wherever necessary on payment of Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) towards re-inspection fee or such amount as may be fixed by

the Governing Council from time to time on the request of the applicant and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

64. The University, if satisfied on the report of the Inspection Commission that all the conditions required to be fulfilled by the applicant College / Institution are fulfilled, shall issue a "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" to the applicant College after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only) per speciality or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time, to enable the College / Institutions to approach the Department of AYUSH, Government of India for necessary permission to start the Post Graduate Course in Homoeopathy. The "Letter of Consent of Affiliation" shall be in Form B annexed to these Statutes. this Statutes, shall satisfy the conditions stipulated hereunder, required for starting the respective Post Graduate course in Homoeopathy.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS OF AN INSTITUTION / A COLLEGE FOR CONDUCTING POST GRADUATE DEGREE COURSE IN HOMOEOPATHY

- a. The Institution / College shall satisfy the minimum requirements for Under Graduate course in Homoeopathy as prescribed by the Central Council of Homoeopathy and in addition shall fulfill additional requirements for Post Graduate Degree Course depending on the nature of speciality.
- b. Facilities regarding teaching in Basic Sciences of Homoeopathy and Medicine related to the subjects of teaching as recommended by the Central Council of Homoeopathy shall be provided.
- c. All the facilities of ancillary departments shall be available for co-ordination of post graduate of teaching.
- d. The institution shall have adequate equipments and research facilities in the speciality concerned.
- e. The institution must have a fully equipped own hospital consisting of at least 1:3 beds with adequate facilities in specialties including O.P.D., clinical lab, X-Ray and Ultra Sound Scan. However, number of beds shall be 3 times higher than that of the sanctioned strength of admission of students in clinical subjects viz. Organon of Medicine, Materia Medica, Repertory, Practice of Medicine, Psychiatry and Paediatrics.

CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED BY THE APPLICANT COLLEGE / INSTITUTION APPLYING FOR PROVISIONAL AFFILIATION FOR STARTING OF POST GRADUATE HOMOEOPATHY DEGREE COURSE:

TEACHING FACULTY:

The staff required for conducting Post Graduate Degree Course in Homoeopathy shall be follows (Department wise):-

(1) TEACHING STAFF PATTERN:

- (i) One full time Professor in the Department of speciality.
- (ii) One full time Reader / Assistant Professor in the concerned speciality.

N.B.: The above teaching staff shall be appointed and available at the time of Inspection for issue of "Consent of Affiliation".

(2) QUALIFICATIONS OF TEACHING STAFF:

(a) Professor:

- (i) Must possess a Post Graduate Degree in Homoeopathy.
- (ii) Teaching Experience: Not less than 7 years as Assistant Professor in the subject concerned or teaching experience of 10 years in a recognised Homoeopathic Medical College.

Provided, if persons with qualification and experience as state in I (i) and (ii) are not available then teaching staff of Professor cadre holding a recognised degree / qualifications in Homoeopathy (not less than 4 years duration) with 20 years Professional experience (including 10 years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a recognised Homoeopathy Medical College) shall be appointed.

(b) Reader / Assistant Professor

- (i) Must possess a Post Graduate degree in Homoeopathy.
- (ii) Teaching experience: Not less than 5 years as Lecturer in the speciality concerned in a recognised Homoeopathy Medical College.

Provided: If persons with qualification and experience as stated in Item (i) and (ii) above are not available then teaching staff in the cadre of Reader / Assistant Professor holding recognised degree / diploma qualifications in Homoeopathy (not less than 4 years duration) with 15 years Professional experience (including 7 years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a recognised Homoeopathy Medical College) shall be appointed.

3. STUDENT GUIDE RATIO:

a. The ratio between the students and Guides (Supervisor) is 3:1 for every batch. He can guide 3 students of every succeeding years too:

Provided that where it is not feasible for a Supervisor (Guide) to supervise the candidates or candidates in any areas of the speciality there shall be one additional "Co-Supervisor / Co-Guide".

b. Educational qualifications and experience for Supervisor (Guide)

A person shall possess the following qualifications and experience for being eligible to be a Supervisor (Guide) namely.

(i) M.D. (Hom.) included in the Second Schedule of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act and

(ii) Teaching experience of not less than seven years as Lecturer in the subject concerned in a recognised Homoeopathy Medical College.

Provided that up to a period of five years from the date of commencement of the Homoeopathy Post Graduate Degree Course M.D.(Hom.) under this University, if Supervisors (Guides) with qualification and experience as laid down in item (i) and (ii) above are not available then teaching staff of Professor cadre holding a recognised Degree / Diploma qualification in Homoeopathy of

not less than four years duration with twenty year professional experience (including ten years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a recognised Homoeopathy Medical College) may be appointed.

Provided that the Supervisor / Guide of a speciality shall remain the Supervisor / Guide for that speciality only.

c. Educational qualifications and experience for selection of Co-Supervisor (Co-Guide)

Post Graduate Degree qualification in the speciality subject with experience as Associate Professor in a College recognised by the Central Council of Homoeopathy.

Hostel accommodation separately for ladies and gents shall be provided in the same premises to enable the Post Graduate students to serve as residents for their respective departments. Single room accommodation can be provided for Post Graduate students.

a. The College shall have Audio-Visual equipments, illustrations Central Photograph Units and Xerox Machines. It shall be under the control of technically qualified non-medical officer.

8. LABORATORY (HOSPITAL)

There shall be a laboratory equipped with the specific requirements of concerned speciality in addition to the basic facilities required for urgent investigation.

9. NUMBER OF POST GRADUATE STUDENTS TO BE ADMITTED

The admission to each speciality should never exceed the strength permitted by the Central Government. However the maximum

number of students that can be admitted in a speciality shall be only 6 (six).

10. OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENTS

There shall be out patient department with all facilities as stipulated by the Central Council of Homoeopathy.

11. SECURITY DEPOSIT

The Management of the Institution shall provide the security deposit of Rs.5,00,000/- (Rupees five lakhs only) for each speciality.

12. PERMISSION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AYUSH, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA FOR STARTING AND FOR INCREASE INTAKE

The applicant college / institution shall obtain and produce the previous permission of the Department of AYUSH, Government of India as required under section 12-A of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (Central Act No.59 of 1973) as amended by the Central Act 51 of 2002 and Regulations and Rules made thereunder for starting the Post Graduate Degree course of Homoeopathy and for the increase in admission capacity.

67. APPLICABILITY OF THE NORMS OF THE HOMOEOPATHY CENTRAL COUNCIL

In addition to the above requirements, the applicant shall also satisfy the norms prescribed by the Homoeopathy Central Council from time to time in respect to the course(s) concerned.

68. The applicant College / Institution after fulfilling the conditions stipulated in the statute 66 & 67 above, shall apply to this University in writing in Form C annexed to these statutes for grant of Provisional Affiliation for starting First

Batch of Post Graduate Homoeopathy Degree M.D. (Hom.) course along with a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the inspection fee payable to the University and shall request the University to depute its Inspection Commission.

69. On receipt of the intimation referred to statute 68, the University shall send its Inspection Commission to inspect the facilities available in the applicant college and to submit report to the University as to the satisfactory fulfillment of the conditions required to be fulfilled. The Inspection Commission shall after verifying the Inspection Proforma submitted by the Management and also report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of any of the conditions required to be fulfilled and also advise as to the capability of the Trust / Society / College to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. In case there are lacunae in the fulfillment of the conditions, the University may conduct such re-inspection wherever necessary on receiving a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the re-inspection fee and shall receive a final report from the Inspection Commission.

70. After detailed examination of the final report of the Inspection Commission, if the University is satisfied as to the fulfillment of the conditions for the Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of M.D.(Hom.) course, the University shall direct the applicant / institution to remit the prescribed security deposit of Rs.5,00,000/- (Rupees five lakhs only) for each speciality or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time. The

Security deposit shall be invested in the form of fixed deposit in a Nationalised Bank or Government Undertaking / Corporation which accepts fixed deposits jointly in the names of the Registrar of the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai and the Management of the College. The fixed deposit receipt shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar. The interest accrued thereon shall be utilised by the institution towards the maintenance of the college.

71. On the remittance of the Security Deposit by the applicant College as required under Statutes 70 above, and on receipt of the intimation from the applicant / institution that all the staff members required for starting the course and are in a position to conduct the teaching course, the University shall grant Provisional Affiliation for First Batch of M.D.(Hom.) course, after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees One lakh only) or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the fee for grant of Provisional Affiliation for the First Batch of M.D.(Hom.) course in each speciality for up to and for 4 specialties. In the event of starting additional speciality in excess of 4 specialties, an amount of Rs.30,000/- (Rupees thirty thousand only) per speciality or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time shall be remitted as Provisional Affiliation fee.

72. The Provisional Affiliation granted by the University shall be only for the First Batch of M.D. (Hom.) course in the speciality concerned.

73. By the time only 6 (six) months period is left for the commencement of Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) course, the management of the institution shall apply to the University for Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) degree course in Form "C" annexed to these Statutes

along with a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time towards the inspection fee payable to the University and shall request the University to depute its Inspection Commission.

74. On receipt of the application along with a copy of Inspection Proforma duly filled in for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) degree course, the University shall send its Inspection Commission atleast five (5) months before the commencement of the Second Batch of M.D.(Hom.) degree course to verify the continuance of the facilities which are provided for First Batch of course in the said institution for running the Second Batch of course also. Besides, the Inspection Commission shall also inspect with reference to the Inspection Proforma and submit a report to the University as to the availability of the infrastructural facilities in the Institution as required by the Central Council of Homoeopathy if any, for conducting the Second Batch of the course concerned.

75. After a detailed examination of the report of the Inspection Commission and if the University is satisfied as to the fulfillment of the condition for the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) degree course and on production of approval from AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and the Central Council of Homoeopathy, the University shall grant Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for the Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) degree course after collecting a payment receipt for Rs.60,000/- (Rupees sixty thousand only) or such amount as may be fixed by the Governing Council from time to time, per speciality for up to and for 4 specialities. In the event of additional speciality in excess of 4 specialities, an

amount of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees twenty thousand only) per speciality shall be remitted as Continuance of Provisional Affiliation fee for the Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) Degree course and for existing batch.

76. The Institution / College shall seek the recognition from the AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India and the Central Council of Homoeopathy when the first batch of students have passed out after their Part-II examination.

77. The Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted by the University in respect of each batch of the Post Graduate Degree course in Homoeopathy is subject to the conditions namely:

An affiliated College / Institution shall strictly conduct the course in accordance with the course contents and Regulations framed by the University and any modifications thereon suggested by the Board of Studies concerned and the Standing Academic Board of this University from time to time.

78. GRANT OF CONTINUANCE OF PROVISIONAL AFFILIATION FOR SUBSEQUENT BATCHES OF M.D. (Hom.) DEGREE COURSE:-

The Management of the Homoeopathy Medical college shall apply to this University after complying with the requisite facilities, as prescribed by the AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and Central Council of Homoeopathy from time to time for grant of Continuance of Provisional Affiliation for subsequent batches of M.D. (Hom.) degree course as prescribed for Second Batch of M.D. (Hom.) degree course stated above along with the fee prescribed therefor.

79. No Homoeopathy Medical College shall apply to the University for increase in seats until the first batch students successfully completed the course and leave the college and the M.D. (Hom.) Degree course so obtained is recognized by the Central Council of Homoeopathy and after obtaining the Continuance of Provisional Affiliation from the University.

80. The applicant M.D. (Hom.) college shall satisfy the University with the following norms as prescribed by the University and the Central Council of Homoeopathy in this regard from time to time while making application for increase in seats in Form 'D' annexed with these statutes with a payment receipt towards processing fee of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand only) per speciality, and cost of application for Rs.1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time.

- (i) Permission from State Government of Tamil Nadu.
- (ii) Proportionate increase in the staff pattern;
- (iii) Proportionate increase in the class room, equipment and laboratory facilities;
- (iv) Proportionate increase in the accommodation; and
- (v) Expansion of Library and
- (vi) Inspection Proforma duly filled in.

81. On receipt of the application from the applicant of the M.D. (Hom.) College for increase in seats, the University shall appoint an Inspection Commission to inspect the suitability of the facilities provided by the college for such increase in seats after receiving a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the

Governing Council from time to time payable to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai towards the inspection fee.

82. The Inspection Commission referred to above shall report to the University with reference to the Inspection Proforma submitted by the Management, as to whether all the facilities required to be provided by the management of the college for increase in seats have been provided. The Inspection Commission shall also point out in its report the lacunae, if any, in the fulfillment of the requirements to be provided and also advise as to the capability of the college to rectify the lacunae within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of receipt of the University communication/letter. The University shall conduct re-inspection wherever necessary on receipt of a payment receipt for Rs.40,000/- (Rupees forty thousand only) or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time by the applicant of the college towards re-inspection fee. The commission shall send its final report.

83. On receipt of the final report of the above Inspection Commission, and if the report is found satisfactory, the University shall recommend to the AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and Central Council of Homoeopathy for an Inspection and concurrence.

84. On receipt of the approval from the AYUSH, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of India, New Delhi and Central Council of Homoeopathy to increase the seats in the college concerned the University shall grant permission to the college concerned to admit students in the seats so increased after collecting the payment receipt for Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) per branch or such amount as may be prescribed by the Governing Council from time to time.

85. The permission granted to the applicant by the University is liable to be withdrawn if any of the norms prescribed above is violated. In case of such withdrawal, the permission shall be restored only when a satisfactory report is received by the University on an inspection that the norms prescribed above have been duly complied with.

GENERAL

86. The University shall be competent to withdraw the Provisional Affiliation /Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted herein by giving 3 months notice stating the reasons therefor, to the management of the college and after considering the explanation submitted by the management of the college. After giving a reasonable opportunity to the management for hearing, the Governing Council shall decide on the question of withdrawal of the Provisional Affiliation/Continuance of Provisional Affiliation.

87. The college/institution shall not enter into any Memorandum of Understanding with other Universities without obtaining the prior permission of this University. The Governing Council shall be competent to entertain or decline to entertain for reasons to be recorded in writing, the application received from the affiliated colleges for such permission.

88. The University shall be competent to conduct surprise inspection suo-motto or on complaints at any point of the year to confirm whether all such institutions are maintained in best condition as per Central Council of Homoeopathy norms. If any deficiencies are pointed out / noticed during the surprise inspection, action will be initiated to withdraw the Provisional Affiliation / Continuance of Provisional Affiliation granted to the particular college/institution.

89. All the fees payable to the University shall be in the mode prescribed by the University from time to time.

90. The regulations prescribed/amended by Central Council for Homoeopathy for appointment of teaching faculty, infrastructure, equipments, etc. shall be applicable from time to time.

91. Prior permission of the State Government/ University is mandatory for shifting of college from one place to another place. 92. Prior permission of the State Government/University is mandatory if there is a change in the Management of the College.

93. The University shall be competent to decide/change the venue of the exam centre at the discretion of Governing Council and to send observers/flying squads during examination. The institution cannot claim the exam centre in their institution as a matter of right.

STAFF, EQUIPMENT, TRAINING AND OTHER FACILITIES

- 3** ¹**Minimum Requirements:** - There shall be attached to every Homoeopathic College a hospital having not less than 25 beds, having the requirements, norms and standards as specified by these regulations in regard to teaching as well as hospital staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities and such Homoeopathic College shall also have one peripheral Homoeopathic clinic for every 10 admissions.

Provided that a Homoeopathic College having facilities specified in these regulations for Degree Course may start Graded Degree Course.

- 4** **Power of Central Council to Call for information and returns:** -The Central Council shall have the power to call for such information and returns as it may deem fit from examining bodies and Homoeopathic Colleges shall furnish the said information and returns in triplicate within the time specified by the Central Council.

- 5** **Facilities for Inspectors and Visitors:-** Every Homoeopathic College shall provide all necessary facilities to the Inspectors and Visitors appointed by the Central Council to discharge their duties and functions.

- 6** ¹**Criteria for Admission of Students:-**Admission of students to Homoeopathic College imparting instructions for Degree course shall be in accordance with the Regulation.

Provided that where any Homoeopathic College is imparting Graded Degree course or Post Graduate Degree course, such college shall provide additional beds as per the student-bed ratio specified under the respective regulations.

Provided further that the existing Homoeopathic Colleges which provide student-bed ratio 1:1 may continue the same without peripheral dispensaries and such college shall inform in writing to the Central Council about their option in this regard within six months from the date of Notification of these amendments

- 7** ¹**Minimum teaching staff:-**

- (1) The minimum number and category of teaching staff:-
(i) for a Homoeopathic College imparting instruction in B.H.M.S. (Degree Course) shall be in accordance with Annexure ;
- (2) Teaching staff for a Homoeopathic College imparting instructions in B.H.M.S. (Degree) and B.H.M.S. (Graded Degree) Courses shall be in accordance with Annexure 'C'.
Provided admission of students to such College however, shall be in accordance with the student-bed ratio of 1:1 in both the courses put together.
- (3) Every Homoeopathic College shall have an apex body consisting of Senior Professors of the college with the Principal as Chairman to schedule the curriculum as also as the training programme for the undergraduate students keeping in view the objectives of training for a basic doctor and giving emphasis for a community oriented training to the students and for making such arrangements necessary for training.

8. Teaching Staff.-

- (1) In Departments of Homoeopathic Pharmacy, Materia Medica (both Pure and Comparative), Organon of Medicine and Homoeopathic Philosophy, Repertory and Practice of Medicine, the teaching staff at all levels shall be on regular full time basis.
- (2) In Departments other than referred to in sub-regulation (1), either the Professor or Reader shall be full-time, and the Lecturers shall be on full-time regular basis.
- (3) The Homoeopathic College shall have a faculty of Guest Professors, for subjects such as Dentistry, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, Orthopedics, Radiology, Cardiology, Dermatology, Gastro- enterology and other sub specialties to impart adequate teaching and training to the students:

Provided that Guest Professor shall take clinical and/or teaching classes at least for two hours on two days in a week in the college or in the attached Hospital.

- 9** **Head of a Homoeopathic Colleges** The head of Homoeopathic College shall be a full-time employee of the said College.

- 10** ¹**Hospital staff.-**The staff in a Teaching Homoeopathic Hospital attached to the college shall be in accordance with Annexure .

- 11** ¹**Qualification etc. of teaching staff:** -The minimum qualifications and age for appointment of teaching staff to various posts shall be in accordance with Annexure ;

Provided that where the service conditions of a staff of a Homoeopathic College have not been provided, the same shall be as per the prevailing service conditions in the affiliating University.

- 12** ¹**Appointment of Guest Professors:-**Homoeopathic College may appoint medical doctors having educational qualifications prescribed in regulation 11 with standing in the profession as Guest/Visiting Professors, and for this purpose the experience as practitioner of Homoeopathy /Medicine shall be considered equivalent to the teaching experience: Provided that no Guest/Visiting Professor shall be appointed as Head of the Department.

- 13** ¹**Equipment, training and other facilities.-** The equipment and other facilities for education in Homoeopathy to be provided by Homoeopathic College and Hospital shall be in accordance with Annexure, and Training and other facilities shall be in accordance with Annexure .

PART III ACCOMMODATION

14. **General:** The Homoeopathic College shall be housed in a building which is located nearest to the teaching Homoeopathic hospital. The College shall have its own land and building for running various departments and hospital with the prescribed number of beds, with scope for expansion.
Central Library shall have space for a minimum of 100 students for reading, with ventilation and adequate space for stocking and display of books and journals, in addition to rooms for Librarian and staff.
Administrative block : Principal's room, staff room, College Council room, Office Superintendent's room, record room, separate common room for male and female students, canteen, a small sale outlet for books and common medicines etc
Six lecture halls each with a seating capacity for 50 to 100 students.
College auditorium to accommodate 500 to 600 persons with proper acoustics.
Central Gas plant, maintenance room/workshop etc. shall also be provided.
Sanitary facilities shall be provided for teaching staff, students (male and female), technical and other staff.
Central Record Room.

- (i) **Teaching staff rooms:** Each of the department shall have accommodation for the Professors, Readers, Lecturers, and Staff, and working accommodation for the non-teaching staff.
- (ii) **Research:** Research room shall be provided for Professors, staff and post-graduate students in the case of colleges with Post-graduate Department for the subject.
- (iii) Separate working room for each Post-graduate speciality shall be provided wherever Post-graduate teaching is available in the subject.
- (iv) **Library:** Accommodation for departmental Library-cum-seminar room shall be provided in all the Departments. The minimum requirement in individual Department shall be as under:

1. Department of Anatomy

- (a) **Dissection Hall** -(i) It shall be spacious enough to accommodate four dissection tables. Provision for ventilation and lighting shall be made; Mosaic tanks for preservation of dissected parts and wash basins and a small office room attached to the dissection hall shall be provided. (ii) Accommodation and provision for storage of cadavers, maceration chamber, storeroom for instruments, chemical and bones and skeletons shall be made.
- (b) **Museum**—Accommodation shall be provided for racks and shelves for storing and proper display of wet and dry specimens, models, revolving stands for skiagram and trolley tables.
- (c) **Demonstration room**— There shall be a demonstration room fitted with audio-visual aids to accommodate 50 students and located in proximity to the dissection hall and museum, with provision for shelves for skiagrams and stereoscopic viewing boxes.
- (d) **Histology** —Sufficient accommodation for workbenches fitted with water taps, sinks cupboards and electric points for 50 students. The room may face North.

2. Department of Physiology and Biochemistry

- (a) **Demonstration room**—There shall be a demonstration room to seat 50 students and with arrangements for audio-visual aids.
- (b) **Practical Class rooms**—Human Physiology room with adequate accommodation shall be provided to accommodate 50 students for blood studies, determination of basal metabolism, blood gas analysis, blood pressure measurements, testing of respiratory functions, recording of pulse and respiration and testing of special senses.
- (c) Animal room and Frog tank shall be provided.
- (d) **Practical classroom for Biochemistry**—Accommodation for Laboratory benches fitted with shelves and cupboards, water taps, sinks, electric and gas points for 50 students shall be provided. A store and equipment necessary for Biochemistry experiments shall be provided. Colleges where there is no separate Biochemistry laboratory for the time being may develop such facility within a period of five years from the commencement of the Homoeopathy (Minimum Standards of Education) Amendment Regulations, 2002.

3. Department of Homoeopathic Pharmacy:

- (a) **Demonstration room** —here shall be one demonstration room to accommodate about 50 students with arrangement for audio-visual aids.
- (b) **Laboratory** —Sufficient accommodation shall be provided for laboratory tables with shelves and cupboard fitted with water taps and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 50 students. A store and

equipment necessary for practical in pharmacy shall be provided.

- (c) Herbarium for medicinal plants shall also be provided
 - (d) **Museum** –With cupboards and shelves for storing and display of herbarium sheets, charts and specimens with adequate sitting arrangements for students shall be provided.
 - (e) College shall provide a medicinal plant garden in its vicinity with facility to grow plants used in Homoeopathic preparations.
- 4. Department of Pathology and Microbiology:**
- (a) **Laboratory** –Tables with reagents, shelves, cupboards fitted with water taps and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 50 students with attached storeroom.
 - (b) In addition, service laboratories for all necessary investigations and suitable equipment shall be provided in the attached hospital.
 - (c) **Demonstration** – One room shall be provided to accommodate 50 students, with arrangements for audio-visual aids.
 - (d) **Museum** –Sufficient accommodation for show cases and cupboards for a minimum of 1000 specimens.
- 5. Department of Community Medicine:**
- (a) **Museum** –Adequate accommodation for the display of models, charts, specimens and other material concerning communicable diseases, diet, Homoeopathic Prophylactics, National Health Programmes, Immunization, Community Health, Family Welfare, Bio statistics, Sociology.
 - (b) Every Homoeopathic College shall adopt a minimum of one village in the periphery and make health camps with the students to make them aware of the community oriented problems and have at least one attached Primary Health Centre..
- 6. Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology:**
- (a) **Museum** –Adequate accommodation for display of medico legal specimens, dangerous weapons, models, charts and audio-visual teaching material.
 - (b) Laboratory for examination of specimens.
- 7. Clinical departments,** (i.e. Practice of Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Homoeopathic Materia Medica & Therapeutics, Organon of Medicine and Homoeopathic Philosophy (including History of Medicine), Case taking and Repertory) shall be attached with the hospital where the hospital is in the unitary campus; and if the hospital is in a different premises, adequate space for the teaching staff shall also be provided in College. Relevant audio-visual teaching aids/material shall also be provided in the concerned departments.

(B) Teaching Hospital in Homoeopathy:-

The teaching Homoeopathic hospital shall provide facilities for imparting practical and clinical skills to make the clinical students self reliant and confident to understand the clinical problem, diagnose the same with a great amount of accuracy, prescribe a rational medication. The students should also be made to understand the scope and limitation of the system. Facility shall be provided to inculcate a sense of research aptitude with Homoeopathic medicine in various clinical fields, render service to the community oriented health problems.

Facility shall also be provided to train on the management of emergencies and take active participation in calamities, life supportive systems and its handling. There shall be facility to handle all types of clinical cases. The hospital shall provide consultants from all fields of Medicine and Rehabilitation. While selecting the experts adequate care shall be taken to see that they have a sense of understanding in the basic principles of Homoeopathy. The Hospitals shall train the students in appropriate diagnostic techniques, other supportive methodologies, research methodology, supervise the patients and to watch the limitations.

The following essential components shall be available in a teaching Hospital:

(C) Physical infrastructure:

The hospital shall have a well-equipped outpatient department with the sections of medicine (including acute and chronic diseases), Surgery (including ear, nose and throat), Gynaecology and Obstetrics, Ophthalmology, Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Dental etc. The indoor and outpatient departments of the hospital shall be in running condition. Round the clock Emergency Department shall be provided.

In addition to the accommodation mentioned, the hospital shall also provide the following:

- 1 Hospital Superintendent's office room with attached toilet, and a retiring room, wherever necessary.
- 2 Visitor's room with toilet facilities.
- 3 Canteen
- 4 Reception and Enquiry: This shall preferably be computerized and networked with other essential areas in the Hospital and College.
- 5 Central Registration.
- 6 Statistics Department with computer facilities.
- 7 Clinical department for Out Patients.

- 8 Clinical laboratory for investigation techniques.
The laboratory shall be equipped to undertake Pathological and Biochemical investigations for the hospital. Space for patients to wait for specimen collection shall be provided.
- 9 An Emergency section with facility to receive patients at any time of the day and night, manned by House-Physicians/Residents supported by Resident Medical Officers, Surgeon, Physician and the Obstetrician shall be available on call duty.
- 10 An In- Patient Department to admit patients.
- 11 Operation Theatre to meet the surgical cases and Emergencies. Hospitals may charge a reasonable fees if they so desire for the services provided to the Patients in order to maintain quality of services.
- 12 Minor Operation Theater to provide minor services
- 13 Labour room.
- 14 Central Store for linen
- 15 Separate store rooms for consumable and non consumable items.
- 16 Medicine store.
- 17 Dispensing room with facility for the patient to wait for collection of medicines.
- 18 Mortuary with facility to preserve the Dead body.
- 19 Residential accommodation for Principal/Medical Superintendent, Resident Medical officers, nursing staff, auxiliary staffs, House staff, Surgeon, Obstetrician and Physician; where Surgeon, Obstetrician and Physician are not provided Residential accommodation in the premises, they shall be available round the clock for call duty and shall be provided with adequate communication facility.
- 20 Central Medical Record Section with facility for a data bank.
- 21 Staff committee room.

The hospital shall arrange consultation of honorary physicians, Guest Physicians or other experts in the medical and allied field and for achieving the objectives.

In the hospital there shall be not less than 2 lecture theatres that can accommodate the number of students permitted for admission to facilitate teaching and training by demonstration of cases.

Clinical Departments in the Hospital:

INDOOR

For Clinical teaching in the hospital the beds shall be distributed as under: -

Clinical demonstration room (At least 1 for each clinical department)

II. Research Laboratories: Each Post-Graduate level College shall develop laboratories for specialised work in the field.

III. Operation Theatre Unit:

Complete Operation Theatre;
Waiting room for patients;
Preparation room;
Postoperative recovery room;
Boiled linen room;
Instrument room;
Sterilization room;
Nurses room;
Surgeon's room;
Assistant's room;
Observation gallery for students with close circuit T.V. facility;
Waiting room for surgeons and Assistants;
Students' washing up and dressing up room.

IV Central Sterilization Services:

Accommodation for Central Sterilization services and necessary equipment, machinery be provided.

V Department of Radiology:

Accommodation in Radiology department for office and the X-ray unit comprising the plant and anterooms, for stores, dark room for developing, waiting room for patients be provided. Ultrasound Machine/facility, where necessary, shall also be provided.

VI Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation:

Accommodation and staff be provided for Rehabilitation therapies (including Physiotherapy and Occupational therapy), Electrotherapy, Diathermy, Ultraviolet and Infra red treatment, Hydrotherapy, separately as far as possible.

VII Yoga and Naturopathy practice facility shall be provided in each Homoeopathic College. This facility be made available, in adequate area, separately earmarked for this purpose.

CLINICAL DEPARTMENT - OUTDOOR

Accommodation-waiting rooms for patients and attendants

Examination rooms (cubicles) and case demonstration room to be provided for all departments in the outdoors in self-contained blocks with their sub-sections.

Dispensing outlets for male and female patients;

Outpatients clinical laboratory, where the hospital is in a different premises.

Following additional accommodation shall be provided in the departments specified below: -

In Surgery and for its specialists	Dressing room for men and Women patients respectively
Minor OT for out patients Surgery	
In ENT Section	Audiometry room
In Paediatrics	Child Guidance Clinic
For Obstetrics and Gynaecology	Antenatal clinic, Family Welfare clinics

Psychiatry.

Reproductive and Child Health centre with sex education.

Specialised Clinics

Central Casualty Department with accommodation for Resuscitation services. Emergency, X-ray, Operation theatre. It shall be fully equipped. The students shall be adequately trained on the life supportive system, body fluid balance, resuscitation services and emergency handling.

An observation ward with beds is also necessary.

Adequate sanitary arrangements for patients, their attendants and the staff of the department shall be provided in the respective blocks:

Provided the provision for unitary campus shall not affect the existing colleges. However up-on change of any course or increase in admission capacity or addition of any new course this requirement specified in this regulation shall be applicable in such colleges. The existing colleges if they do not have adequate space to provide such facilities in one block, may provide the same not too far from the existing campus provided adequate communication facility is made available to the clinical staffs and transport facility provided by the College free of cost to the students.

The Homoeopathic Teaching Hospital shall have well furnished separate dispensaries for its out-door and in-door departments containing sufficient stock of drugs. A first-Aid kit also be kept in Outdoor and Indoor departments/dispensaries. Such a hospital shall have x-ray, E.C.G., Screening and Sonography units, well equipped clinical laboratories and also the rehabilitation unit (consisting of Physio-therapy, occupational therapy, social counseling).

**PART IV
RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION**

15. Hostels and quarters:

- (1) Hostels for male and female students separately shall be provided within or nearby the college campus with sanitary facilities, mess, common room and games facilities. The interns may be accommodated in the hostel near the hospital.
- (2) The College shall develop the campus with additional facility for the staff welfare and peaceful living.

16 Miscellaneous:

(1) Interpretation:

Where any doubt arises to the interpretation of these regulations it shall be referred to the Central Council for clarification.

(2) Power to relax:

Where any University, Board or Medical institution in India which grants medical qualification is satisfied that the operation of any of these regulations causes undue hardship in any particular case, that University, Board or Medical Institution as the case may be, may by order; for reasons recorded in writing, dispense or relax the requirement of that regulation to such an extent and subject to such exceptions and conditions as it may consider necessary for dealing with the case in a just and equitable manner.

Provided that no such order shall be made except with the concurrence of the Central Council.

AGE: Not more than 50 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age is relaxable for exceptionally qualified persons with prior approval of the University concerned.

2 PROFESSOR IN HOMOEOPATHIC SUBJECTS:

A. ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy with two years of experience as Reader or a Degree in Homoeopathy with six years of teaching experience as Reader or Diploma in Homoeopathy of not less than four year duration with ten years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homoeopathic college. The qualification shall be the one included in Second Schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973..

B. DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy with two years of teaching experience as Reader in the concerned subject or a Degree in Homoeopathy with 6 years of teaching experience as Reader in the concerned subject or Diploma in Homoeopathy of not less than 4 year duration with ten years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homoeopathic College.
The qualification shall be the one included in Second Schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

- (i) Experience as Supervisor/Co-supervisor or Guide/Co-Guide for Post Graduate Programme in Homoeopathy.
- (ii) Administrative experience or Research experience in a research institution under the Department of ISM & Homoeopathy of State Government or Central Government in a responsible position.
AGE: Not more than 40 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age is relaxable for exceptionally qualified persons with prior approval of the University concerned.

5 READER IN ALLIED MEDICAL SUBJECTS -

(1) A. ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATION:

Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy with four years of teaching experience as Lecturer in the concerned subject in a Homoeopathic College or a Degree in Homoeopathy with ten years teaching experience as Lecturer in the concerned subject or Diploma in Homoeopathy of not less than four years duration with fifteen years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homoeopathic College. The qualification shall be the one included in Second Schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

B DESIRABLE QUALIFICATION:

- (a) Experience as a Supervisor/Co-Supervisor or Guide/Co-Guide for Post Graduate Programme in Homoeopathy.
- (b) Administrative experience or Research experience in a research institution under the Department of ISM & Homoeopathy of State Government or Central Government in a responsible position.

OR

(2) A. ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATION:

Post Graduate Medical Degree in concerned medical subject recognized by the Medical Council of India with four years teaching experience as Lecturer in the subject concerned in a degree level Medical Institution/ Homoeopathic College.

B DESIRABLE QUALIFICATION:

- (a) Qualification included in the Third schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973
- (b) Administrative experience or Research experience in a research institution under the State Government or Central Government in a responsible position.

Age: Not more than 40 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age is relaxable for exceptionally qualified persons with prior approval of the University concerned. Superannuating age shall be 60 years.

6 LECTURER IN HOMOEOPATHIC SUBJECTS

ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATION:

Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy or a Degree in Homoeopathy with four years of professional experience. The qualification shall be the one included in Second Schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

Age: Not more than 35 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age is relaxable by 5 years maximum for exceptionally qualified persons with prior approval of the University concerned.

7 LECTURER IN ALLIED MEDICAL SUBJECTS:

ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATION:

Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy or a Degree in Homoeopathy with four years of professional experience. The qualification shall be the one included in Second Schedule of Homoeopathy Central Council Act,

1973.

OR

Post Graduate Medical Degree in concerned subject recognised by the Medical Council of India with four years professional experience out of which two years as Resident Medical Officer in a Hospital recognised by Medical Council of India/ Central Council of Homoeopathy.

Age: Not more than 35 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age is relaxable by 5 years maximum for exceptionally qualified persons with prior approval of the University concerned.

Provided that the teaching experience in the concerned subject of persons appointed as regular teaching staff in Homoeopathic Colleges (prior to Notification of these amended regulations) fulfilling the prescribed requirements of Homoeopathy (Minimum Standards of Education) Regulations, 1983 shall be counted for appointment of teaching staff as per Annexure 'C' to these regulations.

The Homoeopathic Teaching Hospital shall have well furnished separate dispensaries for its out-door and in-door departments containing sufficient stock of drugs. A first-Aid kit also be kept in Outdoor and Indoor departments/dispensaries. Such a Hospital shall have X-Ray, E.C.G., Screening and Sonography units, well equipped clinical laboratories and also the rehabilitation unit (consisting of Physio-therapy, occupational therapy, social counselling).

Teaching and other facilities:-

Besides the facilities referred to in all the foregoing regulations, every Homoeopathic college shall also provide well equipped library with reading rooms for staff & students separately; a herbarium, medicinal plant garden, and modern audiovisual equipment's with educative slides, transparencies & films.

Artist, photographers and modelers shall be appointed at-least on part time basis.
