I am to inform that the Meeting of the Board of Studies in Homoeopathy Course was held on 13.11.2017 and discussed various academic matters. The decisions of the Board of Studies in Homoeopathy was approved in the 54th meeting of the Standing Academic Board, held on 07.12.2017 and recorded in Resolution No:40 in the 258th Meeting of the Governing Council held on 18.12.2017 which are detailed below:

Point No.1.

TO DISCUSS AND RECOMMEND THE REVAMPED SYLLABUS FRAMED BY THE EXPERT COMMITTEE FOR THE SUBJECTS OF HOMOEOPATHY UG/PG DEGREE COURSES UNDER AYUSH.

It was resolved to approve the revamped syllabus for the subjects of Homoeopathy UG/PG degree course (AYUSH).

POINT No.2

TO DISCUSS AND DECIDE ON THE PROPOSAL TO RECOMMEND TO THE CENTRAL COUNCIL OF HOMOEOPATHY, NEW DELHI, REGARDING THE SHUFFLING OF PORTIONS ALLOTTED FOR THEORY PAPERS I AND II IN THE SUBJECT OF PRACTICE OF MEDICINE.

It was resolved to address the Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi, regarding the shuffling of portions allotted for Final year Theory I and II in the subject of Practice of Medicine and to solve the disproportionate distribution of topics in those two papers (i.e) Paper I and II of Final year.

Any other item:

To discuss and recommend the supplementary examinations that are conducted for the students to go along with the regular batch of students as there was a break in the First year BHMS course of study only.

It was resolved to follow the CCH Regulations under Results and Readmissions to Examinations No.11 clause iii.

As per the above Regulations, there is a break only in first year but not in subsequent years of BHMS Degree course.

a). The candidate must pass the second BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the Third BHMS examination.

b) The candidate must pass the Third BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the fourth BHMS examination.

Since there is no break in the second, third and final years, the need to conduct the supplementary exam within two months, after the regular examination, does not arise from second year onwards.

As per the above regulations, second, third & final BHMS supplementary examinations shall be conducted within six months from the date of declaration of results.

I am to request that the decision of the Standing Academic Board as mentioned above may be communicated to all the Professors and Heads of Departments for information and further follow up action in the regard. I am also to request that a copy of this letter may be displayed on the Notice Board of the College / Hostel for information of the students concerned.
