POINT NO: 1

TO DISCUSS AND RECOMMEND THE Ph.D. GUIDESHIP REGULATION 2010 TO FRAME THE GUIDELINES FOR CO-GUIDESHIP TO THE FACULTIES HAVING NON-MEDICAL M.Sc. DEGREE WITH Ph.D. IN THE FACULTY OF BASIC SCIENCES

It was resolved that the Persons having the qualification of Non-medical M.Sc. in the Faculty of Basic Science shall be recognized as Co-Guide if she/he **possesses Ph.D.** and have at least **two years post-doctoral teaching experience** in an approved Postgraduate Teaching Department/MCI recognized Institution. She/he shall also have a **minimum of two post-doctoral research publications** in any of the indexed/accredited journals as principal author or co-author.

POINT No. 2

TO DISCUSS AND DECIDE ON THE GUIDELINES FRAMED BY THE EXPERTS FOR THE ISSUE OF GUIDESHIP AND CO-GUIDESHIP TO THE AYUSH FACULTIES TO GUIDE THE CANDIDATES TO PURSUE PH.D. RESEARCH PROGRAMME IN THIS UNIVERSITY

It was resolved to continue the existing guidelines given under the Recognition of a New Guide/Co-Guide in Ph.D Guidelines amended upto 53rd Standing Academic Board for SIDDHA faculty members.

For the AYUSH faculty members other than SIDDHA, it was resolved to follow the guidelines given below for the Recognition of New Guide/Co-Guide for the Ph.D. Research programme of this University.

GUIDELINES FOR Ph.D. GUIDESHIP TO AYURVEDA, HOMOEOPATHY, UNANI YOGA AND NATUROPATHY FACULTIES

In the faculty of AYUSH, the following are the eligibility criteria for Ph.D. Guideship:

1. The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Undergraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach undergraduates in its affiliated AYUSH Medical Institutions (except Siddha) with a minimum of **Fifteen Years Undergraduate Teaching Experience and Five Research Publications** as Author or Co-author. (or)

The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Undergraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach undergraduates in its affiliated AYUSH Medical Institutions (except Siddha) with a minimum of **Fifteen Years Undergraduate Teaching Experience which includes a minimum of Three years teaching experience for Post Graduates and Three Research Publications** as Author or Co-author.

2. The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Postgraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach Postgraduates in its affiliated AYUSH Medical Institutions (except Siddha) with a minimum of **Ten Years Undergraduate Teaching Experience and Three Research Publications** as Author or Co-author.

GUIDELINES FOR Ph.D. CO-GUIDESHIP TO AYURVEDA, HOMOEOPATHY, UNANI YOGA AND NATUROPATHY FACULTIES

1. The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Undergraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach undergraduates in its affiliated AYUSH Medical Institutions (except Siddha) with a minimum of **Ten Years Undergraduate Teaching Experience and Three Research Publications** as Author or Co-author. (or)

The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Undergraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach undergraduates in its **affiliated** AYUSH Medical Institutions (except Siddha) **with a minimum of ten Years Undergraduate Teaching Experience, which includes a minimum of Two Years Postgraduate teaching experience and Two Research Publications** as Author or Co-author.

2. The teaching faculty/Teachers possessing **Postgraduate Degree** accepted by this University as an eligible teaching qualification to teach undergraduates in its affiliated AYUSH Medical Institutions (except siddha) **with a minimum of Five years Undergraduate Teaching Experience and Two Research Publications** as Author or Co-

author.

The Faculties/ Teachers applying for Guide and Co-guide should also have undergone **Research Methodology workshop and Bio-statistics workshop** conducted by the University and produce a Completion Certificate in this regard.

He/She shall also carry out a Research Project under reputed organizations.

The above eligible criteria for Guide and Co-Guideship shall be **“REVIEWED AFTER FIVE YEARS”**.

It was further resolved that every faculty member, applying for Guideship/Co-Guideship should specifically state in their research publications that the published work is a part of THE TAMIL NADU Dr. M.G.R. MEDICAL UNIVERSITY. These faculty members should also have undergone **Research Methodology and Biostatistics Workshop conducted** by this University and produce a Completion Certificate in this regard .

This will be implemented from May 2018 Examination onwards.

In the average of three valuation if the candidate still scores less than 50% marks in aggregate, then in the individual papers in which the candidate has scored less than 50% marks shall be valued by the fourth examiner who shall be invited from other recognized Universities of outside the State and the average marks of all four valuation in these papers shall be taken as a final score for the declaration of results.

This will be implemented from May 2018 Examination onwards.

3.To delete 2nd paragraph from point 27 of Log Book, regarding resubmission & revaluation of the Log Book.

“If the examiners suggest minor corrections and resubmission of the Log Book, the results of the candidates shall be withheld and the Log Book shall be resubmitted by the candidate within three months. The Log Book shall be revalued by the same set of examiners, and after getting approval, the results of the candidate shall be published”.

Further, it was also resolved to approve the syllabus, guidelines & regulations of the post doctoral fellowship in Vascular & Interventional Radiology course (Two Years duration) and recommended to have recent/current edition of Books/journals for reading in the library.

POINT No.2

A. TO DISCUSS AND DECIDE ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE EXPERT COMMITTEE TO INCLUDE MD(PMR) AS ONE OF THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA TO JOIN THE POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN PALLIATIVE MEDICINE (ONE YEAR DURATION) AND POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN MUSCULO SKELETAL RADIOLOGY (TWO YEARS DURATION) COURSES

Resolved to include MD (PMR) as one of the Eligibility criteria to join the Post Doctoral Fellowship in Palliative Medicine(One year Duration).

The Board suggested to convene another meeting including Faculties from PMR and Radiology specialities to consider the inclusion of the MD (PMR) candidates for admission into the Post Doctoral Fellowship in Musculo Skeletal Radiology (Two years duration) course.

Accordingly, the Expert Committee was constituted. Based on the recommendations of the Expert Committee, the Board has resolved not to include MD (PMR) as one of the Eligibility criteria for admission into the Post Doctoral Fellowship course in Musculo skeletal Radiology (two years for the following reasons:

1. It is a Super Speciality Course of Radiology.
2. The syllabus contains CT Scan, MRI Scan and Fluroscopy.
3. The syllabus contains more of Physics. But the basic Physics is not cover in MD (PMR) syllabus.

The approved topic with synopsis, duly forwarded by the HOD shall be sent to the University within one month from the date of receipt of the topic by the Institutions.

2) Every candidate appearing for the post-graduate degree examination shall at least six months prior to the examinations, submit with his form for examination, four typewritten copies of the dissertation undertaken by the candidate, prepared under the direction and guidance of his/her guide. The dissertation so submitted shall be referred to the examiners for their examination and acceptance of it shall be a condition precedent to allow the candidate to appear for the written part of the examination:

Provided that a candidate whose dissertation has been accepted by the examiner, but declared failed at the examination, shall be permitted to re-appear at the subsequent examination without a new dissertation:

Provided further that if the dissertation is rejected by the examiner, the examiner shall assign reasons thereof with suggestions for its improvement to the candidate and such candidate shall re-submit his/her dissertation to the examiner who shall accept it before appearing in the examination.

It was resolved to implement the M.D. Ayurveda Education Regulations 2016, vide ref. No.11011/-1/2016-dated 10.10.2017 & 24.10.2017, on merging of PG Specialities and its seat matrix as follows:-

1.The PG Specialities in Ayurveda viz., shalakya – Netra Roga, Shalakya – Shiro-Nasa Karna evam Kantha Roga, Shalakya – Danta evam Mukha Roga had been merged into one speciality ie. Shalakya.

2.The PG Specialities viz. Shalya – Samanya, kshar karma evam Anushastra karma, Asthi Sandhi and Marmagat Roga had also been merged into one speciality i.e Shalya.

3. Two PG specialities viz., Sangyaharan, chhaya evam vikiran vigyan have been discontinued.

Therefore, the colleges who had been conducting PG course in more than one speciality (for example Shalakya – Netra Roga, shalakya-Shiro-Nasa karna evam Kantha Roga, Shalakya – Danta evam Mukha Roga, Shalya – Samanya, kshar karma evam

Anushastra karma, Asthi Sandhi and Marmagat Roga) under the Shalya or Shalakyia department till last academic year shall now admit students for M.S (Shalya) or M.S (Shalakyia) upto a maximum of twelve seats as per the Regulation 17 of IMCC PG Ayurveda Education Regulations 2016 subject to the following conditions.

a. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 shall not exceed the total number of seats, already permitted by the Govt of India for each college, inclusive of all specialities, which have been merged.

b. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 shall not exceed the total number of seats as per the teacher-student ratio as prescribed in the Regulation 16 of the IMCC PG Ayurveda Education Regulations 2016.

c. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 will be such number, whichever is less, as per the criteria "a" and "b" as mentioned above.

4. The Two different departments viz., Swasthavritta and Yoga are merged into one Department called "Swasthavritta & Yoga" and the total number of seat allocations shall not exceed the number of seats already permitted in each speciality/College.

Any other item:

To discuss and recommend the supplementary examinations that are conducted for the students to go along with the regular batch of students as there was a break in the First year BHMS course of study only.

It was resolved to follow the CCH Regulations under Results and Readmissions to Examinations No.11 clause iii.

As per the above Regulations, there is a break only in first year but not in subsequent years of BHMS Degree course.

a. The candidate must pass the second BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the Third BHMS examination.

b) The candidate must pass the Third BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the fourth BHMS examination.

Since there is no break in the second, third and final years, the need to conduct the supplementary exam within two months, after the regular examination, does not arise from second year onwards.

As per the above regulations, second, third & final BHMS supplementary examinations shall be conducted within six months from the date of declaration of results.

It is mandatory that 10 marks be allotted to the Problem Based Questions wherever applicable and not more than 10 marks for the same.

Example: Subjects like Bio Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Analysis.

4. Practical Examination:

As per the PCI norms there is only one Practical examination for each speciality combining all the subjects. Hence, it was decided that one internal from Pharmaceutical Analysis and another from concerned speciality. One External Examiner of the concerned speciality from other Universities, shall be appointed for the University Examinations (Two Internals and One External totally Three).

However, One Internal and One External examiner to be appointed for the Branches of Pharmaceutical Analysis and Pharmacy Practice. (One Internal and One External Examiner Totally Two Examiners)

5. Component System:-

Component system to be followed for both Practical and Theory examinations.

6. Grace Marks

No Grace marks to be awarded for any subjects.

7. Evaluation

The existing evaluation system should be followed by the University and there is **NO** retotalling /revaluation. The candidates can apply for xerox copies as per the norms of the university.

B.Pharm Degree Course

1. Schedule of Examination.

It was decided to conduct the University exam during 15th February and 16th August of every Academic Year.

2. TMR

The Board recommended the new TMR and Credit based Statement of Marks and New Question Paper Code created by the Examination Computer Cell of the University as per the norms of PCI from the academic year 2017-2018 admission onwards.

3. Question Paper Pattern:-

The Board recommended the Question paper pattern as per PCI norms:-

Long Answers	- 2 x 10 = 20

4. If the candidate has studied both Mathematics and Biology in +2 Board of Examinations the candidate need not take up the examination of Remedial Biology or Remedial Maths in First semester of B.Pharm Degree course.

5.Component System

Component system to be followed for both Practical and Theory examinations.

6. Grace Marks

No Grace marks to be awarded for any subjects.

7.Evaluation

The existing evaluation system should be followed by the University and there is **NO** retotalling / revaluation . The candidates can apply for xerox copies as per the norms of the university.

Further it was decided that an Academic Calendar shall be framed by the Expert Committee for B.Pharmacy and M.Pharmacy Courses.

The Board also recommended to implement the following after getting clarifications obtained from the PCI :-

1.Awarding class in the Transcript/Degree Certificate, as per the CGPA calculation which has been already addressed to PCI..

Till then the Board suggested to continue as specified by the PCI (i.e) a minimum of 50% marks in theory & practical separately, including internal marks in the final semester examinations.
