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I am to inform you that the Board of Studies in Pharmacy Courses, in its meeting held on 13.05.2019 discussed various academic matters. The recommendations of the Board of Studies were placed before the SAB at the 57<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 04.06.2019. The resolutions passed by the SAB are approved at the 270<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Governing Council held on 30.07.2019 which are detailed as below.

#### **Point No.01**

**THE REGULATIONS FRAMED FOR THE ISSUE OF NOC FOR TRANSFER / MIGRATION FROM ONE RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION TO ANOTHER RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION FOR PHARMACY SEMESTER PATTERN COURSE OF STUDY.**

It was resolved to accept the recommendations of the Expert Committee with regard to regulations framed for the issue of No Objection Certificate for transfer/migration from one recognized institution to another recognized institution of pharmacy candidates under semester pattern of study. Further, resolved to accept the carry over of attendance from the transferred college to the transferee college for both semester and non semester pattern of pharmacy courses.

**The regulations for the issue of NOC for Transfer / Migration from one recognized institution to another recognized institution for Pharmacy under Semester Pattern course of study.**

1. Both the Institutions (i.e.) the institution in which the student is studying and the institution to which the Migration/Transfer is sought for should have been recognized by the concerned Central Councils.
2. The applicant shall submit No Objection Certificate from both the institutions (i.e.) the institution where he/she is studying for the present and the institution to which the transfer is sought for.
3. Application for Migration / Transfer will be entertained only after successful completion of second semester .
4. Migration / Transfer shall be effected only after completion of even semesters and after fulfillment of Regulations of the concerned courses.
5. Migration/Transfer shall be effected only at the beginning of the concerned odd semester.
6. The application for Migration complete in all aspects should be submitted to all the authorities concerned within a period of one month of passing the even semester examinations. Such Migration/Transfer will have to be informed to the councils by
  - a. Transferer college
  - b. Transferee college
  - c. University
7. If the candidate has applied for Migration/Transfer during the intervening period of course of study such transfer shall be effected only to the subsequent odd semester course of study (3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Semester)
8. The candidate has to produce a letter from the Principal of the transferee institution that the total number of students including the student for whom the No Objection Certificate has been issued has not exceeded the sanctioned intake for the academic year as approved by the University.
9. The candidates are not eligible for mutual transfer from one institution to another and such requests shall be rejected summarily.
10. The candidates seeking Migration/Transfer on medical and compassionate grounds will only be entertained.
11. Issue of No Objection Certificate for Migration/Transfer are subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
12. The attendance acquired by the candidate at the previous institution can be carried over to the new institution to which the candidate has been transferred.

**Point No. 02**

**THE CHANGE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION DATE OF CONDUCTING THE THEORY EXAMS FOR PHARM D & PHARM D (POST BACCALAUREATE) AND M.PHARM DEGREE COURSES FROM APRIL 2020 ONWARDS.**

It was resolved to ratify the action of the University for having conducted examinations for M.Pharm, Pharm.D and Pharm.D (P.B.) degree courses in April 2019 instead of May 2019 as resolved in SAB and resolved to implement the same from March 2020 & September 2020 for UG courses and April 2020 & October 2020 for M.Pharm, Pharm.D (First to Final Year study of Pharm.D and Pharm.D (P.B. Courses) semester pattern of study. Further, resolved to continue to conduct of the Pharm.D First Year examinations in October 2019 onwards as resolved in the 56<sup>th</sup> SAB.

### **Point No. 03**

#### **THE ADMISSION OF FOREIGN CANDIDATES TO M.PHARM DEGREE COURSE WITHOUT INSISTING FOR THE TAMIL NADU STATE COUNCIL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE.**

The Standing Academic Board discussed on permitting foreign candidates to M.Pharm Degree Course without insisting for the Tamil Nadu State Registration Certificate. During the discussion the members informed that already the Tamil Nadu Pharmacy Council has stopped registering overseas candidates who have done B.Pharm courses for practicing purpose and it was allowed only for further study in India.

It was resolved to seek clarification from Pharmacy Council of India with regard to overseas students who study Under Graduate Course and permitting them to join for Post Graduate Course without insisting on the respective state Pharmacy Council's Registration.

### **Point No.04**

#### **THE PROPOSALS WITH REGARD TO TEACHING FACULTY OF PHARMACY DEGREE COURSES, TIN NO, ETC .**

It was resolved to approve the following recommendations of board with regard to Teaching Faculty of Pharmacy Degree Courses. It recommends that faculty handling Pharm.D can also teach B.Pharm & M.Pharm, students subject to the condition that adequate staff are provided for conducting individual course as per PCI regulation.

#### **TEACHING STAFF REQUIREMENT**

- i) Staff Pattern : All faculty shall be full time. However part time perceptors in hospital shall be allowed.

1. Further, It was suggested that whenever a teaching staff member is appointed in any Institution, the institution should send the name details of the member to the university for obtaining TIN number generated on the Biometric entry of faculty at the university.
2. Also, it was resolved that maximum of eight (8) M.Pharm IV Semester students can be evaluated for Research and Colloquium per day.
3. It was resolved that wherever M.Pharm (Pharmacy practice) specialisation is approved, Pharm.D/Pharm.D(PB) qualified are also eligible to be a faculty to conduct B.Pharm / M.Pharm / Pharm.D/Pharm.D(PB) classes.

**Any other item**

**Pharmacy institutions should ensure the staff-student ratio for all courses as per PCI norms if all/two courses are run by the same institution.**

1. The board recommends that Pharmacy institutions should ensure the Staff – Student Ratio for each course as per PCI norms if one or more courses are run by the same institution.

**The faculty of Pharmacy suggest that those who possess Pharm D can take classes for M.Pharm students.**

2. The board requests for review of action taken on the previous Board meeting regarding pass percentage and internal assessment.

3. The board recommends to avoid second valuation for semester pattern UG examinations from September 2019. Further, it opines that the Pharmacy Council has not prescribed for a second valuation.

The members discussed with regard to the second valuation done for students who fail in first valuation of Pharmacy courses at university and suggested to write clarification from the Pharmacy Council of India.

4. The standard operating procedures for question paper setters and Moderators. The question paper setters shall be instructed to give key for the questions/problem while setting question papers. The questions should be from all units in a balanced manner and essay type questions should be in such a manner to check indepth knowledge of the students and all subdivisions of the essay should be from the same topic.

**It was resolved to have Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for question paper setters and moderators.**

### **INSTRUCTIONS TO PAPER SETTERS.**

1. Questions should set from all units of the syllabus.
2. The questions should not be repeated within the same question paper.
3. The questions from two previous question papers should not be repeated.
4. Every question paper should contain numerical problems, case studies or reaction based problems for 10 marks.
5. Atleast five mark questions should be of the nature of explain why or give reasons for.
6. Key should be provided for all questions. In case of problems stepwise answer and marks allotted should be provided. Send the Answer key along with Question Paper.
7. Avoid using Abbreviations / mnemonics .
8. The question paper should be typed confidentially in MS Word format ( a certificate to the effect that the questions were typed confidentially, be enclosed) and a soft copy in a CD.
9. The question paper model should be followed, for example name of the course, semester or year, Branch, Paper No.I, II & III, Subject Name, Q.P. Code and Mark distribution, etc.
10. Three Different Sets of Question Papers should be set and sent.
11. The question papers must be placed in the confidential inner cover and sealed. The sealed inner cover should be placed in the outer cloth lined cover and dispatched to the Deputy Controller of Examinations by Name by Registered Post with acknowledgment due (Insured for Rs.100/-).
12. The question papers should reach the Deputy Controller of Examinations not later than -----
13. All Communications should be sent only in a cover to the Deputy Controller of Examinations by name.
14. The duly filled in remuneration form should be sent in a separate cover with relevant vouchers for the postal claim.
15. If any member(s) of Your family or Relative is appearing for the forthcoming Examination, kindly decline this offer and return it with all enclosures immediately.
16. Kindly treat this Assignment as "Strictly Confidential".

### **The Moderator should sign the following checklist:-**

1. There is no repetition of question within the different parts of the question paper.
2. The questions are not repeated in the two previous question papers.
3. Every question paper (U.G and P.G ) should carry problems for 10 marks.

- The problems can be numerical or case studies or reactions based.
4. The five mark questions are of reasoning types or explain why.
  5. Abbreviations / mnemonics are not used.
  6. The questions are drawn from all units in a balanced manner.
  7. Key is provided. For problems and case studies detailed steps / points have been provided.

The above decisions are communicated for information and to take necessary action. The Principals are also requested to circulate the above matters among the Professors/ Heads of the Department / Students of their college and also to display it in the College Notice Board and the Department Notice Board for information to the Students.
